

1 **MEETING PLACE FOR GUIDED TOURS**  
Guided tours depart from here on the hour from 10am, final tour departs at 4pm. **DON'T MISS**

2 **CHEYNES IV WHALECHASER**  
Australia's only accessible whalechaser with an exciting audio re-enactment of a whale chase. **DON'T MISS**

3 **FLENSING DECK**  
As part of the guided tour, the audio recreates the process of stripping blubber from a whale.

4 **CUTTING UP DECK**  
The guided tour continues and the audio reflects how the whale was processed and fed into the cookers below.

5 **PROCESSING FACTORY**  
Three huge cookers, used to reduce the whale to liquid to extract the oil, and a dryer are spun into action during the guided tour.

6 **FACTORY OFFICES**  
Once the hub of the whaling company's operations, the building is now occupied by the Whale World administration team.

7 **FACTORY MESS, COOK'S HOUSE & ABLUTION BLOCK**  
Once a gathering hub for the whalers, is now used predominantly for functions.

8 **GIANTS OF THE SEA**  
Skeleton exhibit boasting the state's largest whale skeleton on display, a 22-metre Pygmy Blue Whale, and other marine skeletons found in nearby waters. **DON'T MISS**

9 **WHALE SOLUBLES PROCESSING SHED**  
The recovery plant converted the middle layer of the settled liquid from the processing factory into whale solubles.

10 **ENGINEERING & BLACKSMITH WORKSHOP**  
The workshop now houses early whaling artefacts, memorabilia and equipment and a replica "beetle class" whale boat.

11 **PANORAMA TOWER GALLERY**  
A pictorial and graphical insight into the antics of the whalers from 1950 to 1978. **DON'T MISS**

12 **BOILER HOUSE**  
Home to the working triple expansion steam engine from the scuttled Cheynes III, which is started during the guided tours.

13 **PUMP HOUSE**  
Housing the original steam pumps supplying the town's water from Two People's Bay, the pump house was used to pump the oil to the waiting oil tankers.

14 **OIL STORAGE TANKS**  
Refined whale oil was once stored in those tanks that are now converted into movie theatres (see number 23, 24, and 25).

15 **THE COLIN GREEN HERITAGE GALLERY**  
A sepia photo collection capturing the last eight years of whaling operations. **DON'T MISS**

16 **WILDFLOWER WALK**  
Take the pathway to discover native flora during wildflower season from August to October.

17 **ENTRANCE COMPLEX & NOBIES SOUVENIRS**  
Purchase your tickets for entry to Whale World and browse the extensive range of local crafts, nautical items and souvenirs.

18 **WHALERS GALLEY CAFÉ**  
Enjoy magnificent views, fresh cuisine, snacks and beverages in the indoor or alfresco areas.

19 **PARRY GALLERY**  
Home to the world's largest collection of original marine mammal paintings by world-renowned New York artist Richard Ellis.

20 **SPECTRAVISION THEATRE**  
A state of the art exhibit using miniaturised figures of a whaling family on the day the whaling station's closure was announced. **DON'T MISS**

21 **JOHN BELL FUNCTION ROOM**  
Named after the station's first whale spotting pilot (and Whale World's first Manager), the room can be booked for private functions.

22 **PLAYGROUNDS**  
All abilities playgrounds catering for all ages, complemented by a BBQ, picnic area, shelter shed and party room. **DON'T MISS**

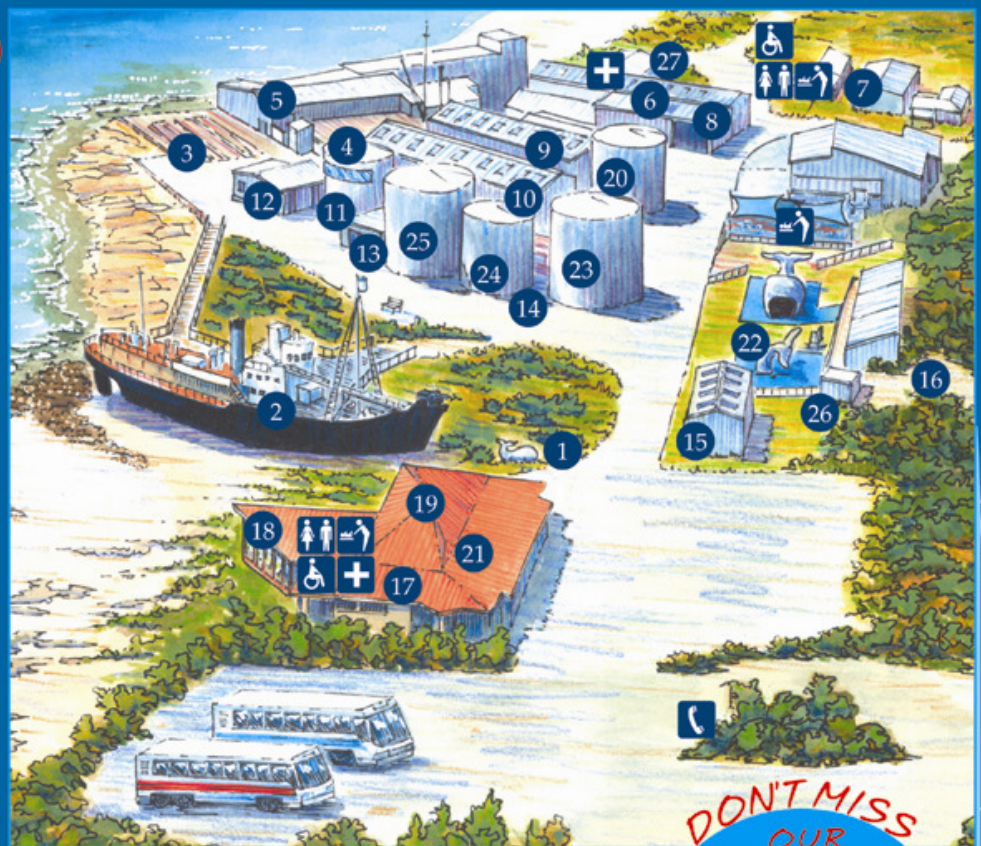
23 **AUSTRALIAN WHALING**  
An eight minute history of Australian whaling showing every 15 minutes. **DON'T MISS**

24 **SHARK**  
An eight minute multimedia show revealing the shark and whaler relationship viewing every 15 minutes. **DON'T MISS**

25 **GIANTS EXIST**  
The world's first 3D animated whale movie screening every 30 minutes. **DON'T MISS**

26 **SPLICING SHED**  
Most of the ropes required for whaling at the station were spliced in this shed.

27 **MCBRIDE'S SEALERS HUT**  
The hut that once stood at Goodie Beach now retells the story and maritime history of the McBride family.

**TRANSFORMING THE STATION**

Located between the Township National Park and the pristine waters of King George Sound, Whale World is on the site of the once operational Cheynes Beach Whaling Company's whaling station. Once an industrial site to render whales to usable products, the station has been transformed into the region's unique premier heritage tourist attraction, taking visitors on a journey of emotional whaling through the site of Australia's last whaling station.  
Over a century of whaling in Australian waters had come to an end.  
The town left for the last time after 26 years of successful operation. On the 21 November 1978, the whalers returned to the harpoon, the last day of commercial whaling in Australia. The harpoon is ready to be used and the skipper free of the sperm whales creates the surface and the skipper free as they wait the anticipation thickens the air. Spectacular Southern Right and Humpback Whales use King George Sound as a nursery during the whale watching season from June to October, so don't forget your binoculars, and a variety of wild flowers can be found while walking around the grounds from August to October.

**RAIN OR SHINE**

Enjoy your experience at Whale World whatever the weather as most exhibits are under cover. However, some of the areas of the guided tour are out in the open with some uneven surfaces so come prepared with sun cream or a rain coat and sensible shoes. In extreme weather conditions tours may be cancelled.

**OVER 20 EXHIBITS TO EXPLORE**

Whale World provides a free guided tour with every admission and effectively brings together the past with the present-day with fully immersive state-of-the-art technology recreating the dramatic sounds and images of the old whaling station. Witness the machinery once used to render whales to oil, restored and operating, including the triple expansion steam engine of the Cheynes III.  
After the excitement of the tour take time to admire the spectacular skeleton exhibit, boasting the state's largest Pymmy Blue Whale skeleton, and the world's largest marine mammal Parting collection and rest on the arcos of the whalers in the Panorama Tower. Experience the watery realm of whales in the world's first 3D animated movie or dare to enter the shark multimedia theatre and discover the ocean's most feared predator. An experience not to be missed!

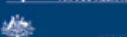
